



# SPORTING REGULATIONS

## APPENDIX R 2023 Motorsport Australia W.A FORMULA CLASSIC STATE SERIES

### R1. OBJECTIVE

The objective of the series is to promote and foster racing for Historic Racing and Sports cars manufactured between January 1<sup>st</sup> 1961 and December 31<sup>st</sup> 1993.

### R2. CATEGORY ORGANISERS

The category organiser is Formula Classic Racing Inc. (FCR Inc.)

Category Representative: Craig Thompson

Technical Officer: Ricky Virago

### R3. ELIGIBILITY

3.1 Cars compliant with the applicable technical regulations and technical bulletins issued by Motorsport Australia, and issued with a log book for the following classes.

- (i) Formula Libre Cars built before 31<sup>st</sup> December 1990 and complying with the Formula Libre Regulations as per the Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport for the year in which the car was manufactured.
- (ii) Sports cars manufactured between January 1<sup>st</sup> 1961 and December 31<sup>st</sup> 1993.

A high performance licence is required to compete in the following 5<sup>th</sup> Category vehicles.

- FIA Formula 1 in Group O,P,Q and R
- Indycar in Group O, P, Q and R
- Group F5000
- Sports over 3 Litre in Group Q and R
- FIA Group C1 and C2 Prototype



- 3.2 Each car shall comply with the "General Requirements for Cars and Drivers" from the Motorsport Australia Manual of Motorsport 2022.
- 3.3 Traction control. The use of electronically programmable launch control or traction control is not permitted.
- 3.4 The category Technical Officer in addition to 5th Category appointed Eligibility Officer/Technical Delegate may request an inspection of any competing vehicle for compliance with eligibility rules. Any inspection must be conducted in the presence of the competitor. Inspections may be random. The category Technical Officer does not have the power to act on a possible infringement; however, they may refer matters to the Chief Scrutineer.
- 3.5 Any inspections may be conducted by the Chief Scrutineer in accordance with any provisions of the Motorsport Australia Manual, including but not limited to matters referred by the Technical Officer in addition to 5<sup>th</sup> Category appointed Eligibility Officer/Technical Delegate, whether under section 3.4 above or otherwise. Where a matter has been referred to the Chief Scrutineer the inspection shall be conducted in Parc Ferme following the next practice, qualifying or race session if it cannot be agreed with the competitor to conduct it prior to that. The Technical Officer in addition to 5<sup>th</sup> Category appointed Eligibility Officer/Technical Delegate may assist the Chief Scrutineer in any inspection if so requested by the organisers or the Chief Scrutineer.
- 3.6 References in sections 3.4 and 3.5 to the Technical Officer / Chief Scrutineer / 5<sup>th</sup> Category appointed Eligibility Officer / Technical Delegate, shall be equally applied to their appointed delegates (in the case of the Technical Officer, this appointment must be in writing).

#### **R4. DRIVER ELIGIBILITY**

- 4.1 All Drivers with the appropriate competition licence, an Circuit Licence being the minimum requirement for:
- Any vehicle requiring HPL
  - FIA Formula 2 in Group Q & R
  - Formula 3000 in Group R
  - Formula Holden in Group R
  - Sports over 2 litre in Group Q & R

For additional licence requirements refer to **R3** 3.1 (iii)

#### **R5. SERIES & POINTSCORE**



- 5.1 A separate point score shall be maintained for the Outright Series and for the Handicap Series.
- 5.2 For the Outright Series, the 2023 Motorsport Australia W.A Race Series Sporting Regulations 3.3 & 3.4 (i) Point Scores will be used.
- 5.3 Trophies provided by the promoters at each round shall cover 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Outright Series.
- 5.4 FCR Inc. will award points to Handicap placegetters at each round and publish the progressive standings on the Formula Classic Website.
- 5.5 At the conclusion of the season trophies shall be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place finishers in the Handicap Series.

## **R6. COMPETITION NUMBERS**

- 6.1 Competitors may request and reserve a competition number, which will be allocated for their use at each round of the series.

## **R7. RACES**

- 7.1 Races will be conducted during scheduled Series rounds, and races may be spread over one or two days in consultation with the Event promoter.
- 7.2 The series will be conducted over no less than 5 rounds.
- 7.3 Each round of the Series shall comprise a minimum of 3 sprint races. If more races are held, all will count towards the point score.
- 7.4 Grid positions will be determined for the first race according to the qualifying times and thereafter it will be progressive grids.
- 7.5 In the event of more than one qualifying session being scheduled, grid positions will be determined according to a driver's best time in any session.

## **R8. SPONSORS**

Competitors shall carry any series sponsor stickers in a clearly visible location as nominated by the organisers for series sponsors.
